To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing this letter in support of Professor Chuck Allison's application for promotion to full professor. I have known Chuck for at least one year, as a colleague and as a member of the faculty senate. Given my experience with him in such a professional capacity and my experience at a range of institutions of higher education, I feel qualified that I may offer an honest and valid appraisal of his work for the university and his potential as a full professor.

Prof. Chuck Allison is a vital and genuine member of the faculty here at Utah Valley University. Prof. Allison has served this university above and beyond in his capacities as Faculty Senate President, as a professor, and as a scholar; therefore, I highly recommend him for promotion to full professor without reservation.

First, I would like to discuss Chuck's work with the faculty senate. To my knowledge, Chuck has served as Faculty Senate president for two years (2008-2010). During this time, I have seen Chuck work through a multitude of complex issues. I have been witness to Chuck's intrepid attitude and his fervent diligence as this institution made the conversion from a small college to a major university. Chuck has been instrumental in the authoring and management of numerous policy documents, essential to the operation of this university; and, he has shown great interest with respect to the faculty, staff, and administration in crafting only the best policies possible.
